Outside of work, Fred enjoys spending time with his daughter and wife and is still active in sports- specifically basketball and soccer. Though being an executive at a startup takes up a great deal of his time, he makes sure to prioritize his family and enjoys working on construction projects within his home. Fred was involved on several committees and executed many small roles within the chapter during his time as a Gamma-Rho. "It was a good community for being active outside of school," says Fred of his time in the brotherhood, "I enjoyed my time there and living in the house on campus." When it comes to his favorite memories, Fred specifically remembers one Spring Break in Mexico. When returning from the trip. he and three other Gamma-Rhos traveled in a Saturn through a blockade of buses on strike. While speaking almost no Spanish, the brothers had to navigate the Mexican military, two blown-out tires, and a drive back to Hermosillo to repair a truck. It was experiences like this that brought Fred such close friendships in the house, most notably the best man at his wedding-Scott Gossett.

Fred gives practical advice to current undergraduates: "Actually show up for classes. Yes, many lectures are horrible to sit through, but learning through osmosis is a thing. Think hard about having a degree like accounting, engineering, marketing, biomedical research, or even journalism— you just won't make as much!"

Mike currently lives in San Diego (where he was born and raised) with his wife, Jessica and two daughters. Lexi and Vivienne, where he is a partner in the downtown San Diego law firm of Solomon Ward Seidenwurm & Smith LLP. Mike's professional practice involves representing businesses (large and small), business owners, individuals and professionals regarding their corporate, partnership/LLC, tax, real estate, estate planning and other contractual matters. Mike has received great accolades for his success, with recognitions including (but not limited to) San Diego Business Journal's 'Most Influential People in San Diego' (2022) and 'Top 100 Leaders in Law

While an undergrad, Mike served as the chapter Social Chair, Rush Chair, Scholarship Chair and Song Chair, and spent his sophomore and senior years living in the fraternity house. He kept himself busy outside of the chapter as well, with involvement in Spires Sophomore Honorary, Chimes Junior Honorary, Blue Key National Honorary, Optimi Honorary, Order of Omega, Phi Alpha Delta and served as the chair for GAMMA. Still a proud alumnus, Mike has been on the board of the University of Arizona Alumni Association's San Diego chapter (the BeachCats) for more than twelve years.

"The best experience I had during my four years of college was my time in the fraternity," says Mike of what Gamma-Rho means to him, "The growth I achieved as a person during those four years of my life was due to the fraternity not what I learned in any particular class."





Daniel Bistany '03 graduated Summa Cum Laude from the University of Arizona in 2007 with a degree in Economics. Today, he lives in Costa Mesa, California, with his wife Kelsey and son Evan "Bash" Bistany. Daniel serves as the Co-Founder and President for Breeze IT alongside fellow Gamma Rho Brandon McKennon '03, and together they provide tailored IT solutions to their Southern Californian clientele.

With several years of recognition as one of Inc. 5000 and Orange County Business Journal's 'Fastest Growing Private Companies,' Breeze IT has established itself as a community leader for IT services in California. Before his success in founding this company, Daniel began his journey as an Associate for Semler Brossy Consulting Group and later founded Offneptune LLC, a strategic internet marketing firm. Proving his expertise and playing an instrumental role in Breeze IT's almost-perfect satisfaction rate, Daniel is involved with ITT Technical Institute as a member of the Program Advisory Committee and was invited to be their Commencement Keynote Speaker– as well as speaking and delivering presentations for Cloud Technology and Security.

Daniel engages with philanthropic organizations and serves an active role in his community. Breeze IT has seen incredible success in the southern California area. Along with numerous years of recognition as one of Inc. 5000 and Orange County Business Journal's 'Fastest Growing Private Companies,' the company has received accolades from several organizations for its community involvement, cost efficiency, and customized solutions. Brandon works alongside many fellow Kappa Sigmas through Breeze IT and attributes a great number of his career achievements to the relationships he forged within the brotherhood.

Brandon is an incredibly active member of his community. In partnership with another Gamma-Rho brother, David Gosselin '01, he founded a young professionals' group focused on community service and business networking. Now retired after numerous years of success in the insurance industry, he lives in Tucson, Arizona with his wife of 35 years– Kerry– and enjoys spending time with his three children and grandson.

Andy began his career at Allstate Agency, soon becoming a multi-year recipient of the Honor Ring and National Champions awards. After twelve years of accolades at Allstate, he became an Executive Pharmaceutical Representative for GlaxoSmithKline. "With GSK I launched eight new brands, exceeding incentive goals for all products, was selected to be an Associate Product Trainer, and served on the Field Advisory Board," Andy says of this period of his career, which lasted for ten years before he moved to Farm Bureau Financial Services as an Insurance Agent.
