In all these situations, there were brothers who I looked up to that networked so naturally, who led effortlessly, commanded fiercely, spoke passionately, argued tirelessly, or advocated relentlessly. After only a short period of time, Rob and Adam's product was on Amazon. The product was a huge success and completely sold out. Adam says, "The intention wasn't for money. It was education for our kids. You have to be able to recognize a problem and realize if you see a problem, you can fix it."
